The program will help users learn to recognize the signs and symptoms of teenage depression and suicidal behaviors, assess suicidal risk for an individual teenager and decide on an appropriate intervention. Users of the program learn about these topics by directing interviews with adolescents, reading case material, watching physicians conduct interviews, analyzing data, making decisions about diagnosis and intervention. Supplemental materials include information about pharmacotherapy for depression, statistical trends in adolescent suicide, a glossary of psychiatric terms, and a bibliography.
