That trip goes well, including a serendipitous meeting with Aipit, an aging native and once Tobias' friend and lover. Tobias then agrees to go to Peru to look for the people whom he joined on a murderous raiding party and with whom he indulged in cannibalism

3 videodiscs (DVD) (171 min.)

In "Smile pretty" Teenage girls from a cross-section of ethnic backgrounds open their hearts about life as a beauty queen, discussing the pressure to fulfill a societal ideal, the allure of celebrity, and the artificiality of the modelling trade. In addition, they share incidents of heroism and sacrifice, feelings about their struggle for personal identity, and insights into the mother/daughter relationship. In "Run like a girl" the sports of rugby, synchronized swimming, and double- Dutch jumping provide the context for teenage girls from a cross-section of ethnic backgrounds to probe the issues of adolescence. They discuss their feelings of liberation within the strict regimentation of competitive sports, their search for identity and

self-esteem while revolting against the stereotyped expectations of others, body image, dating, and the importance of mothers and coaches as mentors. They also tackle social concerns, including bulimia, self-injury, suicide, broken homes, teenage pregnancies, and crime. In "Baby love" a diverse group of teen mothers, some as young as 13 years old, speak out on a wide range of topics, including love, virginity, sex, pregnancy, birth, parenting, their families, and their babies' fathers.

This program looks at the effects of family violence on the abused and the abuser: at the danger that abused children will grow up to repeat the pattern of violence in their own relationships; at the physical and emotional abuse women suffer at the hands of their husbands and lovers. While showing the benefits of therapy, it stresses the need of the abused for safety from those who abuse them - shelters, hot-lines, and community assistance

Whites often forget that they, too, have a culture. Rita Hardiman was the originator of White Identity Theory, and has stimulated much research and theorizing. William Cross does the interviewing. Includes: white experience as a culture, alerting whites to history; racism as a white problem; stages of white identity development; and working with stages clinically. Includes strategies for counseling and facilitating growth and movement away from oppression

Discusses a prison simulation experiment conducted in 1971 with students at Stanford University and considers the causes and effects that make prisons such an emotional issue. Documentary includes new film, flashback editing, follow-ups 20 years later, and an original music score; reveals the chronology of the transition of good into evil, of normal into the abnormal.
