VIGNETTES OF CULTURALLY DIFFERENT COUNSELING: Working With Clients Different Than You

1 videodisc (DVD) (44 min) BF637.C6V53 2000dvd

Live demonstrations of multicultural counseling and therapy exploring issues of religion, physical challenge, gender and age, and language

Men and Women: Differences

1 videocassette (VHS) (23 min.) BF692.2 .M46 1995v

A program on the social and psychological differences between men and women and the debate as to whether biological or social and familial factors are the cause. Also describes recent research on differences between male and female brains

TOUGH GUISE: Violence, Media, and the Crisis in Masculinity

1 videodisc (DVD) (ca. 105 min.) BF692.5.T68 2002dvd

Looks systematically at the relationship between the images of popular culture and the social construction of masculine identities in the U.S. at the end of the 20th century. Jackson Katz argues that there is a crisis in masculinity and that some of the guises offered to men as a solution (e.g., rugged individualism, violence) come loaded with attendant dangers to women, as well as other men.

EPOCA: The Making of History 1992

1 videocassette (VHS) (93 min.) D16.8.E66 2002v

Provides a montage of significant events from the 20th century. Images, documents and texts all collide with each other forming a history quilt. The directors argue that one should not believe these images or their staging. They believe that authentic historiography neither exists nor should it exist and they offer examples of the appropriation of history like that practiced in the former Soviet Union to prove their point.

The Life and Times of Rosie the Riveter

Five women, who worked in the shipyards and defense plants during World War II, recount their experiences at work and offer comments on society's expectations of them during the war effort and after the war. Their narratives are interspersed with sequences from war department films, newsreels, and Hollywood movies made during that time which concerned women working outside the home

THE FRENCH REVOLUTION: Liberte, Egalite, Fraternate, A New Republic is Born in Blood

1 videodisc (DVD) (100 min.) DC148.F721 2005dvd

Documentary that encapsulates the period of the French Revolution from King Louis XVI, Marie Antoinette, and Maximilien Robespierre to Napoleon Bonaparte.

JAPANLAND 2005

2 videodiscs (DVD) (ca. 225 min) DS822.5.J46 2006dvd

Documentary filmmaker Muller committed to living in Japan for a year in order to deepen her appreciation for Eastern ideals. What she's after--more than understanding tea-serving etiquette or the historical importance of the shogun--is wa: a transcendent state of harmony, of flow, of being in the zone.

The Exiles

From 1933 until 1941, large numbers of scholars, intellectuals, artists fled Europe for America. Personal narratives of these refugees from Nazism and other totalitarian regimes of the time are shown interspersed with historical film clips and reenactments. Friends, colleagues and cultural historians describe the influence of these refugee scholars and artists on the U.S.

Harry Hopkins: At FDR's Side

A comprehensive documentary on Harry Hopkins, friend and key adviser to Franklin D. Roosevelt. Using rare film and interviews, it examines the forces that propelled Hopkins to center stage and explains his belief in America and public service

Holding Ground: The Rebirth of Dudley Street

Through the voices of committed residents, activists and city officials, this documentary shows how a Boston community, the Dudley Street Neighborhood, was able to create and carry out its own agenda for change

Living in America: A Hundred Years of Ybor City

Documents the rich tradition of Latin culture of Ybor City, Florida, which was founded in the 1880's and flourished until World War II when the effects of assimilation, urban renewal and the decline in the cigar industry led to its demise

KEEP THE RIVER ON YOUR RIGHT 2000

In 1955, while a Fulbright scholar, a gay Manhattan painter named Tobias Schneebaum spent seven months in the Amazon basin with the Harakambut. When he returned to the US, he could no longer paint. What happened? Nearly 45 years later, filmmakers David and Laurie Shapiro want Tobias, now 78 and suffering from Parkinson's, to return to Peru. He refuses but allows that he will revisit the Asmat in New Guinea where he spent an idyllic time years before. That trip goes well, including a serendipitous meeting with Aipit, an aging native and once Tobias' friend and lover. Tobias then agrees to go to Peru to look for the people whom he joined on a murderous raiding party and with whom he indulged in cannibalism

RACE: The Power of an Illusion

A film about tough and highly competitive quadriplegic rugby players who have been forced to live life sitting down, but in their own version of the full-contact sport, they smash each other in custom-made gladiator-like wheelchairs.

Concludes with scenes of regional planning.

The Rise and Fall of American Business Culture.

As the United States' chief trading partner, Canada has a direct interest in developments in the US economy. This program explores the economic problems of the US at the end of the 20th century. With serious malaise in the manufacturing sector, the US has been forced to buy more than it can sell. Under Reagan, the US came to rely on invalid economic theories and this program suggests a radical change of attitude will be required if the US is to hold its own in the next century.

Seeing Windows.

Documentary that looks at some of the social and economic conditions in Russia under Yeltsin, particularly those having to do with the availability of food and goods.

The Debt Crisis.

Discusses the foreign debt crisis in Zambia and the economic decline that has cut its citizen's standard of living by twenty-five percent in the last decade.

Moral Values and Effective Leadership.

Examines the role of moral values in leadership, concluding that effective leadership springs from commitment to basic moral values.

Tom Peters, the Leadership Alliance.

Story of the Hormel workers strike in Austin, Minn. in 1985-86. The 1984 the Hormel company made \$29 million in profits, but cut its workers benefits by 30% and salaries by \$2 an hour. Looks at the development of American smoking habits and the current controversy between smokers and non-smokers.

Advertising Alcohol: Calling the Shots.

Blessed are the Peacemakers

Shows three communities which are taking action to stop violence on the streets, among young people, and in families. In New Orleans, a multi-denominational organization called ACT (All Congregations Together) works to purge neighborhoods of drugs, guns and delinquent landlords. In Los Angeles, two projects work to keep young people from joining gangs by providing counseling, positive role models, and

educational support. In Appleton, Wisc., a group of women who have experienced domestic abuse work to help other victims of family violence

THE HISTORY OF SEX 1999

Explores the history of sex and sexual practices around the world from ancient civilizations through the 20th century. Takes a revealing, and lighthearted look at the role of sex in society.

Love & Death in America : Sexual Revolution/AIDS

20th century with Mike Wallace Series

A sexual revolution began in America in the 1960s with the advent of the birth control pill and a general loosening of attitudes. Then, just a few decades later, the spectre of AIDS, coming on the heels of other sexually transmitted diseases, brought the revolution to a halt. The program examines how the revolution affected American culture and how AIDS produced reactions of ignorance and fear and ended the notion of sex as a simple pleasure without consequences

The Lost Children of Rockdale County

This program uncovers the roots of the Conyers epidemic and reveals a community struggling with teenage drug use, sex and cynicism

Special Feelings.

Focuses on love between people with severe physical disabilities, providing statements and interviews with handicapped persons and couples at Inglis House, a Philadelphia residence for the disabled. Shows realistically and unsentimentally the problems and rewards of their relationships.

Getting It.

Four college students (two men and two women) discuss the difficulties of sexual communication. They talk about their successes and failures in sexual dialogue and offer suggestions for improving communication between men and women.

I Wish I Could Have Said No.

Three women share their stories of sexual situations on which the line between wanted and pressured sexual contact was difficult to discern, and where each handled a sexual proposition in a different manner. One woman was able to identify her desires, set her limits and assert herself to her partner. Another woman was able to look back on her consent to unwanted sex, learn from that experience, and make decisions for her future based on that experience. Through the examination of a past regretted sexual experience, the third woman begins to discover her own voice and recognize her needs.

Lesbian, Bisexual, Gay & Transgendered Youth Counseling

Tape 1 presents basic facts and information on sexual orientation counseling. Includes demonstrations.

To a Safer Place.

Sexually abused by her father from infancy to early adolescence, Shirley Turcotte retraces her family's nightmare. She shows how one can overcome this trauma and build a successful life.

Paris is Burning.

Story of the young men of Harlem who originated "voguing" and turned these stylized dance competitions into glittering expressions of fierce personal pride. A story of street-wise urban survival, gay self-affirmation, and the pursuit of a desperate dream

DIVERSITY RULES OK! The Changing Nature of Families

Defines the different types of families and how their size and structure have changed over the years. Focuses on couples, families, and the blended, or step family, sole parent families, and the extended family, with other topics discussed include lesbian couple families, surrogacy, divorced families and the future of family life in an aging population

Chillysmith Farm.

Over a period of ten years, the Tugend and Jury families experience the death of two grandparents and the birth of a child. Photos, tape recordings, stills, and motion picture footage explore ways the family members deal with these events.

That's A Family

Designed for children in elementary school, this film shows the many different shapes that families take today. Children describe their own families and explain concepts like "birth mom", "mixed race", "gay and lesbian", and "stepdad."

Children of Children.

Looks at the growing problem of teen and preteen pregnancy and its devastating effects on young parents, on society, and on their children.

Abortion, Stories From North and South.
