On the Bowery

Designed for children in elementary school, this film shows the many different shapes that families take today. Children describe their own families and explain concepts like "birth mom", "mixed race", "gay and lesbian", and "step-dad."

Streetwise

Shows the lives of 9 homeless teenagers, ranging in age from 13 to 19, who survive on the streets as pimps, prostitutes, muggers, panhandlers, thieves and drug dealers

LATE ADULTHOOD

The series begins with a look at the "social convoy," an in-depth exploration of the social relationships that accompany the late adult through the final stage of the human cycle. "Retirement & options for living" covers this major psychological, emotional, and financial event. Finally, "Death, dying, bereavement and widowhood" focuses on the end of life, which human beings experience differently in different cultures

White Identity Theory: Origins and Prospect

Whites often forget that they, too, have a culture. Rita Hardiman was the originator of White Identity Theory, and has stimulated much research and theorizing. William Cross does the interviewing. Includes: white experience as a culture, alerting whites to history; racism as a white problem; stages of white identity development; and working with stages clinically. Includes strategies for counseling and facilitating growth and movement away from oppression.

Surviving Friendly Fire

Ten thousand homeless youth live on the streets of Hollywood. They are runaways, some are "throwaways," abandoned or forcefully exiled from their family's homes. Their average age is fifteen. About a third of them are gay, lesbian or transgender. In their survival these young people endure familial abuse, suicide attempts, drugs and alcohol, prostitution, and life on the streets. In 1992, seventy homeless youth registered for a theater project in the Hollywood shelter where they lived. Over a period of seven months their stories were shaped into monologues, scenes and songs. Of the original seventy, ten completed the project and became performers. In 1993, they performed their play "Friendly fire" at the Los Angeles Festival and toured high schools throughout the city. This is a documentary about the ten teenagers and the hardships they endured.

Dark Days

Documentary,, about a community of homeless people living in a train tunnel beneath Manhattan. Depicts a way of life that is unimaginable to most of those who walk the streets above: in the pitch black of the tunnel, rats swarm through piles of garbage as high-speed trains leaving Penn station tear through the darkness. For some of those who have gone underground, it has been home for as long as 25 years.

Been There: People's Emergency Center, Philadelphia

Follows two women on a journey from homelessness to self- sufficiency. Terri Palmer, a caseworker and formerly homeless mother at PEC, is assigned to work with Kelly Stancil, a 19- year-old mother of two who came to PEC due to intense family discord. The film demonstrates the complexity of Kelly's situation, the barriers that case workers face, and how a positive role model can be used as an intervention tool to build trust between client and case manager.

SISTER HELEN 2001

In 1986, at the age of 56, Helen Travis became a Benedictine Sister after she lost her husband and both her sons to substance abuse. Two years later, in New York City, she opened a halfway house for recovering male addicts

GIRL HOOD 2003

Coming-of-age stories of Shanae and Megan, two girls trying to make a life for themselves both inside and outside of Baltimore's juvenile justice system. Shanae was ten years old when she was gang-raped by five boys. She responded by turning to drink and drugs, and then at age 12, graduated to murder. Abandoned by her mother, a heroin addict turned prostitute, Megan ran away from ten different foster homes before being arrested for assault. Both girls ended up in the Waxter Juvenile Facility, home to Maryland's most violent offenders.

The Evolution of Hospice Care

Clear title and subtitles identify the skills and strategies employed by the counselor.
