Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology (Psy.D.)

The Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology (Psy.D.) is a professional program intended for those students who have completed a bachelor's degree in psychology, or a related field, and others who hold a master's degree in a mental health discipline. It is a five-year full-time program that has a partial part-time option. The part-time option allows two levels of the program to be completed over four calendar years for a maximum time frame of seven years from entry to degree completion. The program follows the practitioner-scholar model of training clinical psychologists, and as such, an intensive integration of theory and practice is stressed throughout the entire course of study.

Criteria

Admission to the program is competitive and limited. Those applying should present the following:

- Either a master's degree from an accredited institution with a B+ (3.2) average; or a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution with a B (3.0) average.
- Competitive scores on the Graduate Record Examination.
- Strong letters of recommendation.
- A well-written and impressive Statement of Intent.
- Effective presentation in the finalist interview.
- Standing in the applicant group on all criteria considered.

Admission to the program does not imply admission to candidacy for the doctoral degree.

Thank you for your interest in our Psy.D. Program. In order to be considered for admission to the program, you must submit all of the following:

1. A completed **Admission Application Form**. All items are to be completed and the form requires your signature.
2. A \$40 non-refundable **application fee**. Make the check payable to La Salle University.
3. **Three letters of recommendation** from professors and/or supervisors familiar with your work. The letters should be returned to you in sealed and signed envelopes and forwarded with your application materials.
4. A **Personal Statement** to be included with your application materials.
5. Results of the **Graduate Record Examination**. The results are to be submitted to the Doctor of Psychology Admissions Committee.
6. Official **transcripts** from all graduate and undergraduate colleges and universities you have attended. Transcripts are to be sent directly from the schools to:
