In 1996, a syphilis outbreak struck teenagers in the prosperous community of Conyers, Georgia, a suburb of Atlanta. This program uncovers the roots of the Conyers epidemic and reveals a community struggling with teenage drug use, sex and cynicism

**BOYS: The Weaker Sex? 2002**

Focusing on behavior and learning ability, this program asserts that male brain structure and chemistry, in combination with the traditional concept of masculinity, are a liability to the socialization and maturation of boys. Evolutionary biology, the effects of prenatal androgens on the brain, male peer pressure, and the use of role play and panel discussions in the classroom to promote emotional expression and understanding are discussed.

In "Smile pretty" Teenage girls from a cross-section of ethnic backgrounds open their hearts about life as a beauty queen, discussing the pressure to fulfill a societal ideal, the allure of celebrity, and the artificiality of the modelling trade. In addition, they share incidents of heroism and sacrifice, feelings about their struggle for personal identity, and insights into the mother/daughter relationship. In "Run like a girl" the sports of rugby, synchronized swimming, and double-Dutch jumping provide the context for teenage girls from a cross-section of ethnic backgrounds to probe the issues of adolescence. They discuss their feelings of liberation within the strict regimentation of competitive sports, their search for identity and self-esteem while revolting against the stereotyped expectations of others, body image, dating, and the importance of mothers and coaches as mentors. They also tackle social concerns, including bulimia, self-injury, suicide, broken homes, teenage pregnancies, and crime. In "Baby love" a diverse group of teen mothers, some as young as 13 years old, speak out on a wide range of topics, including love, virginity, sex, pregnancy, birth, parenting, their families, and their babies' fathers.

**FAMILY VIOLENCE: BREAKING THE CHAIN**

This program looks at the effects of family violence on the abused and the abuser: at the danger that abused children will grow up to repeat the pattern of violence in their own relationships; at the physical and emotional abuse women suffer at the hands of their husbands and lovers. While showing the benefits of therapy, it stresses the need of the abused for safety from those who abuse them - shelters, hot-lines, and community assistance

**Gender, The Enduring Paradox**

A look at the changed and unchanged facets of gender in today's society and families. Shows how discriminatory roles are often imposed on one because of gender

Includes: white experience as a culture, alerting whites to history; racism as a white problem; stages of white identity development; and working with stages clinically. **Quiet Rage: The Stanford Prison Experiment.**
