#### **Language Says It All: Establishing Clear Communication With the Hearing-Impaired Child**

Discusses the deaf child's need for language and communication skills. Focuses on four families and how they come to understand their deaf child's need for language. Provides information and role modelling for accepting the deaf child in the home and in the world
