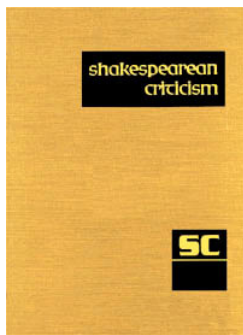




If you are doing **SERIOUS RESEARCH** on a play by Shakespeare, use the following sources:

Connelly Library Catalog.

To locate criticism of a play in books that are in the library's circulating collection, type Shakespeare's name in the library's catalog as a subject. Your search results will display Shakespeare's name followed by various subdivisions, such as **BIBLIOGRAPHY, CRITICISM AND INTERPRETATION, FILM AND VIDEO ADAPTATIONS, and STAGE HISTORY.** Collections of criticism of a particular play will appear under the title of the play as a subdivision, (e.g., **SHAKESPEARE, WILLIAM, 1564-1616. HAMLET.**)



Literary Index.

This online source indexes *Shakespearean Criticism* (REFERENCE 1ST FLOOR PR2965 .S44). To locate criticism of a play, type the title of the play in the Title Search form that is provided. Your search results will list the volumes of *Shakespearean Criticism* that contain entries on the play.

INTERNET RESOURCE: Type *Literary Index* as a title in the library's catalog to obtain the link to it.
