Summary: War film set in Vietnam in the spring of 1965. The Pentagon is planning to drop an H-bomb on Hanoi to end the war. The man chosen to lead the operation, Captain Steiner, is shot down with secret documents while flying into Saigon. Three Asian soldiers are chosen to penetrate Viet Cong territory to search for the Captain: Lt. Comez, Sgt. Aquino and Sgt. Ramos. They in turn are captured and sent to an underground POW camp where Steiner and other Americans are held. The camp is run by sadistic Vietnamese camp wardens Tuan and Bien. Lt. Comez frees the prisoners and leads their escape to the nearest American base.
