**Summary:** medical melodrama set in the fictional St. Elegius Hospital in Boston.

**Summary:** Dr. Chandler (Washington) experiences long-suppressed resentment when he treats a Vietnamese patient. Chandler's brother was killed at Khe Sanh. Dr. 'Boomer' Morrison (Morse) was a peace activist who further enrages Chandler. Dr. Mark Craig (Daniels) is a hawk. Chandler eventually goes to Washington, D.C. to visit the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and see his brother's name. The episode ends with him touching the name on the Wall.

### **A room with a view** (10/8/86)

**Cast:** William Daniels, France Nuyen.

**Summary:** Debut episode for Dr. Paulette Kiem (Nuyen) a female surgeon of Vietnamese extraction (recurring 1986-88). She arrives to serve as Dr. Mark Craig's replacement and he behaves boorishly towards her.
