Manor-La Salle Dual Admission Students: Please refer to the Dual Admission application for eligibility requirements. Students interested in applying to La Salle through the Dual Admission program must sign the Dual Admission Application before completing 45 college-level credits. The Dual Admission Agreement includes a Core-to-Core component. Under the Dual Admission agreement, La Salle University's Core will essentially be fulfilled by the Core at Manor College.

**Non-Dual Admission students** who transfer to La Salle University will be required to complete the entire La Salle Core, which includes specific courses in a number of disciplines. Coursework can be taken at La Salle or prior to transfer. Seek advisement for course options and visit the La Salle website, <u>www.lasalle.edu</u>, to view the current course catalog.

\*Although exemption determined through credit by examination is an option at Manor, please note, students will be required to take a Computer Science course at La Salle if CS 105 or 106 is not taken at Manor.

## Advising Notes Related to Major Course Requirements:

- 1) Communication Tracks at la Salle include Communication Management, Journalism, Mass Media, and Public Relations.
- 2) For the Mathematics Elective, take MH101 College Mathematics or higher for transferable credit. NOTE: some mathematics courses are not transferable.
- 3) Credit for courses taken at Manor that are not at college level will not transfer to La Salle. These courses include MH080 and MH090.
- 4) Paralegal courses are not transferable.
- 5) Non-Dual Admission students are required to complete the entire La Salle Core. Courses can be taken at Manor to satisfy Elective credits that will also fulfill the La Salle Core, including: Biology or Chemistry; Economics or Political Science; Psychology or Sociology; Literature; History; History of Art, History of Music or Foreign Language. HS 110 History of Music and HS 111 History of Art are both transferable courses, either one of which will satisfy a Fine Arts/Language Core requirement at La Salle. HS 101 or 105 will fulfill a History core requirement and HS 102 can be used to fulfill another core requirement. All other HS courses at Manor transfer as History electives.

### **Additional Notes:**

- 1) The maximum number of credits that a student may transfer to La Salle is 70. Additional courses beyond the Associate degree can be taken at Manor to meet program requirements at La Salle. A transfer student must complete at least half the major courses at La Salle.
- 2) Students are required to submit official transcripts after each semester in which additional coursework was earned. It is the students' responsibility to make sure that La Salle has their most recent and updated transcripts before starting classes. All final transcripts MUST be received before attending La Salle. Failure to comply will result in a hold on all future registration at La Salle.
- 3) Students are strongly advised to use this guide with the assistance of the Manor College Transfer Center. The information in this transfer guide is subject to change. Therefore, students are advised to check periodically with the Transfer Center for up-to-date information and to contact the Assistant Dean at La Salle, listed below, for advisement on major requirements that can be taken at Manor. Following this guide does not guarantee the transfer of credit or admission to La Salle University.
