Transfer Credit

Transfer credit is awarded for a course taken at an accredited institution which is equivalent to a course offered at La Salle. Transfer credits appear on the student's record with the name of the institution, course title, and number of credits. The grade point average reflects only work taken at La Salle.

Repeat Calculation

All repeated courses are viewable on the transcript. A repeated course (notated with "E") is excluded from the GPA. The higher grade (notated with "I") is counted in the academic index and the cumulative total is adjusted.

Renewal Policy

Undergraduate students who return after 5 years and successfully complete 12 consecutive credit hours with a grade of C or better may have all D and F grades renewed. Renewed grades are not included in cumulative totals but remain on the transcript.

Authenticity

The transcript is official when each page bears the University Seal and the facsimile signature of the University Registrar. The name of the University appears in small type across the face of this document. The paper has been treated to show alterations and the word "VOID" will appear when photocopied. A black & white copy is not an original and should not be accepted as official.

Continuing Education Units

The Continuing Education Unit or C.E.U. is a nationally recognized unit of measure standardizing participation in non-degree continuing education courses. C.E.U. is defined as (10) contact hours in an organized program under responsible sponsorship, capable direction, and qualified instruction.
