Please NOTE: Students may complete the requirements for the bachelor's degree program within two years, although certain majors may require more than 20 courses, which could result in extended time at La Salle.

CCC-La Salle Dual Admission Students: Please refer to the Dual Admission application for eligibility requirements. Students interested in applying to La Salle through the Dual Admission Agreement must complete the online admissions application before earning 45 college-level credits. The Dual Admission Agreement includes a Core-to-Core component. Under the Dual Admission agreement, La Salle University's Core will essentially be fulfilled by the Core at Camden County College. In order to meet the requirements of La Salle's Core, students must take one CORE "qualifier" at La Salle, REL 100: Religion Matters. This course must be taken at La Salle because there is no equivalent course offered at the community college.

Non-Dual Admission students who transfer to La Salle University will be required to complete the entire La Salle Core, which includes specific courses in a number of disciplines. Coursework can be taken at La Salle or prior to transfer. Seek advisement for course options and visit the La Salle website, www.lasalle.edu, to view the current course catalog.

* When equivalent courses are worth different credit amounts, the course will be satisfied, and the amount of credit earned will transfer

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Notes for Dual Admission Applicants:

- 1) Dual Admission applications must be completed on La Salle University's website prior to earning 45 credits, www.lasalle.edu. Applications are free.
- 2) CCC transcripts must be submitted at the time of admission review.
- 3) Additional courses beyond the associate degree can be taken at CCC to meet program requirements at La Salle.
- 4) Final official transcripts must be sent as soon as the final semester is completed, and associate's degree conferred.
- 5) Dual Admission applicants for full-time day programs will be eligible for the Dual Admission Achievement Scholarship.
- 6) Dual Admission is available for the Nutrition Didactic Program only and not the Nutrition Coordinated Program.

Additional Admission Requirements for Nutrition Applicants (Dual Admission and regular transfer):

- 1) Two letters of recommendation; one must be academic in nature
- 2) An essay or personal statement
- 3) Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 as well as a science GPA of 2.75 or better (science GPA includes Anatomy and Physiology I and II, Microbiology and Chemistry).
- 4) Students are permitted to repeat one science one time in order to obtain the required 2.75 science GPA.
- 5) Students are required to submit official transcripts from all previous colleges attended. It is the students' responsibility to make sure that La Salle has their most recent and updated transcripts before starting classes. All final transcripts MUST be received before attending La Salle. Failure to comply will result in a hold on all future registration at La Salle.

Additional Notes:

- 1) The maximum amount of transfer credits awarded cannot exceed 90.
- 2) At least half of the courses required by the major department (i.e., major requirements) must be completed at La Salle.
- 3) All full-time day applicants will be eligible for the merit-based Founder's Scholarship. The award amount will depend on grade point average and quality of curriculum.
- 4) The Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship is offered to full-time day transfer applicants who are members of PTK with a 3.5 cumulative GPA or above. Proof of membership is required to qualify for this scholarship.
- 5) Non-Dual Admission students should seek advisement on General Education Elective courses that will satisfy the La Salle Core.
- 6) Students are strongly advised to use this guide with the assistance of transfer services at CCC. The information in this transfer guide is subject to change. Therefore, students are advised to check periodically with transfer services for up-to-date information and to contact the Assistant Dean at La Salle, listed below, for advisement on major requirements that can be taken at CCC. Following this guide does not guarantee the transfer of credit or admission to La Salle University.
